
DREAM WITH JEREMY

Children experiencing poverty and homelessness must overcome tremendous barriers for the rest of their lives. **Family homelessness** is a national crisis that continues on an upward trend. Dream Centers is combating the poverty that often leads to homelessness by **strengthening** families through the Dream Centers Women's Clinic, and **intervening** to support families already experiencing homelessness through Dream Centers Mary's Home.

Jeremy, a boy experiencing homelessness in our community, recently told me, "I want to be a dentist!" He saw how many people living around him on the streets needed new teeth.

Dream Centers wrap-around services, supportive housing and nurturing relationships establish firm foundations so families can **rebuild dreams** ... so Jeremy can become a dentist. With the purchase and remodeling of a four-unit apartment complex next to Mary's Home, you have catalyzed Dream Centers to serve four **additional families** in 2020. And as our numbers **continue to grow** at the Women's Clinic, renovations and updates are in the works for the Clinic in 2020.

Dream Centers is committed to continue to address **points of pain** in our community as we enter this new decade of providing health and hope in our community.

THE NUMBERS ARE STARTLING

10% of women in Colorado ages 18-44 were not covered in 2019 by public or private health insurance. Additionally, more than one in 10 women said they did not receive needed mental health care in the past year.







DREAM CENTERS WOMEN'S CLINIC

defines "success" as meeting the mental, physical and spiritual needs of uninsured and underinsured women and teens by providing free access to quality women's healthcare and mental health care.

Since the Dream Centers Women's Clinic began in 2011, the Clinic has served more than **10,000 women** and had nearly **50,000 patient contacts.**





DREAM CENTERS MARY'S HOME

defines "success" as a single parent mother who is able to graduate with holistic health and sufficient career resources so as to live a stable and successful life with minimal reliance on government assistance.

Since Dream Centers Mary's Home began in 2015, **21 families** have successfully exited our program. Last year, Mary's Home graduated **2 families**.

Dream Centers Women's Clinic provided: 2,506 medical, 1,741 counseling, 1,478 chiropractic, 260 ultrasound, and 2,176 other services and referrals. Dream Centers programs impact more than 1,300 uninsured and underinsured women and teens, and single mothers with young children experiencing homelessness

Dream Centers Mary's Home provides a comprehensive and life-changing supportive housing program for 15 families to rebuild their dreams. Dream Centers volunteers gave 19,223 volunteer hours, adding up to nearly half a million dollars in value for our clients and community.
