

# A Letter from Dream Centers CEO

At four years old, my dad began boarding the city bus on Sundays seeking the safety of the church. My mom grew up in a stoic, hardworking family as a pastor's kid. I spent my own childhood and teen years in a rooted, Lutheran church, in a loving home. Our families of origin establish the lens that we look through for the rest of our lives whether we realize it or not.

That lens is then sharpened by experiences of contrast changing us forever. Some of my early encounters include staying at a friend's house overnight and experiencing the unstable family; hosting people in need; feeling the beauty of Yellowstone; losing it emotionally when my brother was seriously injured in a fight; feeling the mutual respect and admiration for/from a teacher and coach. These crystallizing moments imprint us with deep and lasting emotion. They become a part of who we are.

COVID-19 and the associated isolation is a human experience that left its mark. Within the walls of the Women's Clinic, there were countless crystalizing moments for patients. The safety and encouragement, love and healing women experienced was a salve to their souls. The generous, grounded spirit of donors, volunteers, and partners made it possible. I know many, if not all, of our patients will look back on 2020, remembering the contrast between a lonely season and the bountiful love of a gracious God.

When the mothers at Mary's Home suddenly lost jobs and were thrust into homeschooling their kids online all while they pushed through their own career development, we were concerned it would all be too much. Instead, we were pleasantly surprised. The Mary's Home sisterhood is stronger than we ever realized, and the stories of finding new rhythms of grace--gardening together, letting go of plans and expectations, deepening friendship with each other--are the experiences of the residents of Mary's Home in 2020. The Mary's Home Program is extremely challenging. In the words of one recent Mary's Home Academy graduate, the program in 2020 was "far more difficult than we imagined, yet we met that challenge together." Families forged real friendships in their shared experience, and they continue achieving more than they thought possible.

The intergenerational impact you make is nothing short of miraculous. When I think of the crystallizing moments patients and families continue to experience, I am moved by the health and hope they will talk about for years to come. Know that you are following Jesus in His ways when you support the mission of Dream Centers. Know that your work is a long obedience in the same direction. It is the most excellent way of love. As you read through this report, be encouraged that you are partnering well and making it possible for people to experience the kind of crystallizing moments that mark them with love forever.
